Secured US Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration designation as Sustainable Polymers Tech Hub and \$400K strategy development grant. Designation provides opportunity to compete for \$70 million to advance our work and will support industry attraction.

Drove effort to establish funding for new State of Ohio Innovation Hubs to leverage private investment in Ohio in places like Greater Akron to pursue innovation and growth agendas that will benefit the state.

From lobbying the DeWine Administration to engaging with the Ohio House and Senate, Akron has paved the way for significant investments in multiple unique high-growth opportunities across Ohio.

Several years of conversations with Ohio's Congressional Delegation resulted in successful lobbying efforts to include language in Senate version of NDAA to redesignate rubber as a strategic material which will result in increased R&D funding for the polymer industry.
